Tuition

Tuition is due in full at the start of the semester. All students enrolling in a course must send a non-refundable deposit of \$300 per course upon receipt of notification of acceptance to guarantee a place in class. This deposit will be applied toward the tuition balance. Students registering after the registration deadline will be charged at late fee of \$300 (returning MA students) or \$100 (new MA, certificate, and continuing ed. students).

Financial Aid

Please note the following: (1) The Application for Financial Aid is on the following page. Please follow the directions carefully; (2) Only M.A. and certificate students are eligible for financial aid; (3) Financial aid is granted for the fall, spring and summer semesters; (4) Financial aid will cover the full academic year (fall/spring) when the student registers for the fall semester and continues in the spring semester. Re-application is not needed for the spring semester. Students who have registered for the spring semester, and not for the previous fall semester, will be considered for aid only for the spring semester; (5) Financial aid is not available to auditors; (6) Financial aid may be applied toward tuition only. It does not cover the application or student services fees, books, transportation, fines or other course materials or fees; and (7) Students may apply for only *one* category of scholarship or financial aid.

TUITION GRANT

Up to \$1,000 off tuition per semester is available for both first-time and returning applicants who otherwise could not afford to attend our program. In addition to demonstrating financial need, returning students must have received at least a 3.33 GPA during the previous academic year in order to qualify. Students receiving the tuition grant for both the fall and spring semesters must receive at least a 3.33 GPA in the fall semester in order to maintain financial aid in the spring.

STATESMAN SCHOLARSHIPS

The Institute awards to qualified U.S. citizens and U.S. permanent residents a limited number of competitive scholarships that cover up to \$5,000 off tuition per semester.

Recipients of this scholarship must be enrolled in at least eight credit hours per semester. These scholarships are awarded according to the following criteria: financial need; academic qualifications; a character recommendation; and an essay. The character recommendation form is located in this application packet. Returning students must have received at least a 3.67 GPA during the previous academic year in order to qualify. Students receiving the scholarship for both the fall and spring semesters must receive at least a 3.67 GPA in the fall semester in order to maintain financial aid for the spring semester.

Preference for these scholarships is given to M.A. candidates, though certificate students may also be considered depending on availability of scholarship funds.

U.S. PUBLIC SERVICE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Institute offers U.S. government personnel in the military, diplomatic, and intelligence fields up to \$2,500 off tuition per semester. Those eligible for this scholarship include all active, reserve, and retired U.S. military personnel, U.S. diplomatic personnel, and

U.S. intelligence community personnel. Students receiving this scholarship must be enrolled in at least eight credit hours per semester. Students must demonstrate that they do not receive tuition reimbursement from their employer.

To qualify, you must demonstrate financial need and submit documentation verifying (1) your current status in the armed forces, diplomatic or intelligence communities and (2) that your service or agency cannot reimburse you for the full cost of tuition. Returning students must have received at least a 3.33 GPA during the previous academic year in order to qualify. Students receiving the scholarship for both the fall and spring semesters must receive at least a 3.33 GPA in the fall semester in order to maintain financial aid for the spring semester.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

These competitive scholarships provide up to \$4,000 per semester and are awarded based on the following criteria: financial need; academic qualifications; a character recommendation; and an essay. The character recommendation form is located in the application packet. Returning students must have received at least a 3.33 GPA during the previous academic year in order to qualify. Students receiving the scholarship for the fall and spring semesters must receive at least a 3.33 GPA average in the fall semester in order to maintain financial aid for the spring.

Students eligible for this scholarship must be in possession of, or intend to apply for, a visa issued by the U.S. Department of State. Permanent residents of the U.S. are not eligible for this scholarship. Students must also be enrolled full-time (at least nine credit hours per semester), in accordance with their visa requirements.
